About UCL

UCL Application Deadlines

- <u>31st March</u> for September start
- <u>30th September</u> for January start

There is some degree of flexibility with these deadlines, and SELCS department would still accept completed applications **until** <u>31st May</u> for September starters and **until** <u>31st October</u> for January starters. However, we strongly advise students meet the main UCL deadlines to avoid disappointment with admission and accommodation.

Application Process

NOMINATIONS

• Student nominations should be e-mailed to SELCS department via <u>selcs.studyabroad@ucl.ac.uk</u>. Students will then receive helpful application instructions from our department.

Start Date

All incoming students are expected to arrive at UCL approx. <u>**1** week before the official academic</u> <u>year begins</u>, to attend the <u>Orientation Programme</u> (which includes final module registration).

Term Dates

For information on UCL term dates, please click here.

- Semester 1 = autumn term (teaching and assessment), slightly shorter than 3 months.
- Semester 2 = <u>both</u> spring term (teaching) <u>and</u> summer term (assessment), approx. 5 months in total.

Important information for Erasmus students spending only autumn semester at UCL:

- Please note that UCL semester 1 (autumn term) is shorter than 3 months / 90 days.
- Although UCL autumn term is less than 90 days, it should be acceptable by the home institutions as a full academic term for the purpose of Erasmus mobility for studies. These rules are specified by individual national agencies in each country and application of this rule seems to vary, however, please note the Erasmus+ Programme Guide which explains that "Minimum duration of a study period is 3 months, or 1 academic term or trimester" (please see the small print for point 24 at the bottom of page 35).
- If students are required by their home institution to spend at least 3 months (90 days) at UCL, we recommend that they apply for semester 2 instead, which consists of term 2 and term 3 respectively and lasts 5 months (from early January to early June).

Undergraduate (BA) Modules (Courses)

Students must take a minimum of 50% of their modules (credits per semester) in SELCS. They can take the remaining 50% in SELCS or in <u>other UCL departments</u>, subject to the availability of places and provided they meet the prerequisites for modules they wish to attend.

All students are expected to take modules worth **60 UCL credits per semester** (equivalent to 30 ECTS credits / 16 US credits). For example, 4 modules worth 15 UCL credits (7.5 ECTS / 4 US credits) each. If approved by home university, students may take a **reduced number of credits**.

- Provisional registration (pre-registration) on SELCS modules begins in late spring (for September starters) or in November (for January starters).
- **Final** module registration takes place after students arrive at UCL, during <u>Orientation Programme</u>.

IMPORTANT: SELCS department can pre-register students only on SELCS modules. Registration for modules in other UCL departments usually takes place after students arrive at UCL, during Orientation. Places on modules in other UCL departments are usually available, but cannot be guaranteed.

Transcripts (Exam Results)

All transcripts are produced centrally by **UCL Registry** (not SELCS department) and posted directly to the students' home universities by **late February/March** (for affiliates studying at UCL in autumn term only) and by **late August** (for affiliates studying at UCL for the whole year or in spring semester only).
