Support for Students with a Disability	Arrangements for the exchange have to be agreed on in connection with the nomination.
	The sending institution is responsible for covering all extra costs in connection with the exchange.

Application procedure	• The Departmental coordinator sends the student's contact information (e-mail) to the Housing Office.
	• The Housing Office will then contact all students via e-mail in mid-May (arrival autumn) /mid-October (arrival spring) to inform about how to apply for housing.
	NB As the housing situation in Stockholm is rather difficult, please note that we cannot guarantee housing for all students.
	However, students not receiving housing at first will be placed on a waiting list and will get information how to search for alternatives.

Course credits	Courses normally contain 7.5, 15 or 30 credits. Students can choose 1 course 30 credits, or two courses 15 credits courses, or four 7.5 credit courses - or any other combination.
	Courses can be offered daytime or late afternoon/evening.
	Courses $7,5 - 15$ credits are sometimes offered at slower pace $25-50\%$.
	One week of full-time studies equals 1.5 credits. The workload is estimated to 40 hours per week, including lectures, readings, assignments, seminars, independent studies.
Choice of courses	The semester is divided into 2 periods, each period consists of 10 weeks of studies.
	All courses at SU have got a course plan, (unfortunately not all are in English), that states content, examinations etc.
	The student should be aware of not choosing all courses the same period. This may cause problems, both with workload and schedules.
	For questions regarding choice of courses please contact your departmental coordinator at the Department of Romance Studies and Classics.

	• Students staying a whole academic year can make a preliminary choice for the second term. The departmental coordinator will contact the student in October for the choice of courses for spring.
Required number of courses	As many as the home university requires. Full time studies: 30 credits/semester (ECTS)
Examinations	Examinations are arranged throughout the year with no fixed examination periods.
Grading system	A-F
Transcript of records	Transcripts of records are sent to the home university approximately one month after the end of the term.
