Application Procedure	Once students have been nominated, they will be sent a link to apply online. During the application they will need to upload the following: 1. Learning Agreement 2. Letter of recommendation from a supervisor, tutor etc 3. University transcript, detailing all exams taken in higher education 4. Curriculum Vitae 5. A passport-type photograph The relevant Department and College consider the application and we will let the applicant know whether the application has been accepted.

Estimated costs of living (housing, food, transportation, etc.)	Students should expect living costs for the year to be around £9,160. Students should have sufficient finances for the duration of their stay at Cambridge. Please note that students may be asked for financial guarantees to cover accommodation costs. It is not possible for students to undertake paid work during their study or to claim College/University financial aid. Erasmus grants are to be paid by the home university, not the host university.
