Non-EU/EFTA nationals and nationals from Croatia	For most Non-EU/EFTA nationals a student visa is required. Information on visa requirements is available at https://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/home/entry-switzerland-residence.html .			
	The visa process takes at least 8 weeks. A tourist visa does not authorize to study in Switzerland.			
	After arriving in Switzerland students have to apply for a residence permit in their place of residence. A relevant form will be provided by the International Office.

	Students from Non-EU/EFTA countries who have health insurance in their home country have to apply for exemption from mandatory health insurance in Switzerland. The relevant form will be provided by the International Office. If health insurance in the home country is not sufficient according to Swiss law, they have to take out Swiss health insurance or an international students health insurance which is recognized in Switzerland (e.g. Swisscare).
